2023 Weir Farm Artist-In-Residence Program

Call for Artists Announcement



Wilton, CT – Weir Farm National Historical Park and Weir Farm Art Alliance are excited to announce the open Call for Artists for the 2023 Weir Farm Artist-In-Residence Program. The Park is dedicated to American Art and the creation of contemporary art in this premier National Park Service Artist-in-Residence Program. Six artists will be selected competitively through a juried process for one-month long residencies to take place from May-October 2023.

Weir Farm NHP invites applications from artists representing a wide range of perspectives, diversity, and media (e.g., painting, drawing, photography, printmaking, sculpture, mixed media). Graduate and doctoral students, emerging and professional artists aged 25+ at the time of application may apply. Applicants must be eligible to travel to and within the United States. Residents must provide their own transportation to and from the park, as well as any supplies, provisions, and gear for the duration of their stay. A weekly stipend is provided. Artists live in the park in a furnished cottage and have full access to a purpose built Artist Studio.

To be considered for the 2023 Weir Farm Artist-in-Residence Program, artists are welcome to submit their application here by February 1, 2023.
