


## Welcomes September 2023 Weir Farm Artist-in-Residence Erin Treacy







Softening the line between naturalism and abstraction, inspired by textures in the stratum of landscape, and guided by intuition, Erin Treacy develops dense compositions and unexpected palettes. "I am interested in how our environment depicts time through layers of growth and decay, and how this can serve as a visual metaphor for our own internal worlds," says Treacy. "Both are in constant states of change -morphing and diverging to meet the needs of the present situation."

Visual investigation of the park through paintings, drawings, and photography will inform Treacy's studio work during her residency at Weir Farm NHP.




## More about September's Artist-in-Residence

Treacy has earned numerous residencies and grants, some of the most influential were MICA PT Faculty Grant (2020), Windy Mowing Residency, VT (2019), Queens Council on the Arts, Arthotel Residency & Grant, Queens, NY (2017), The Wassaic Project, Wassaic, NY (2017), 2 Rooms Contemporary Art Project, Newfoundland, Canada (2016), and the Sam & Adele Golden Foundation, New Berlin, NY (2023,2012). She was a Fulbright Fellow in painting to Ireland, 2009-10.

Treacy looks for little moments of beauty in unexpected places and then piles them into compositions where forms are not 'namable' but rather referential - a place to explore and celebrate amongst the layers of complicated information. She strives for multiplicity in perception and reception.
